

#### What do we mean by "Transformative Conservation"?



 Input: Rethinking the relationships between nature, society, and individuals in light of nature's contributions to people, equity and justice, and sustainable development goals;

• Output: Restructuring systems to create durable change at large geographic, ecological, political-economic, and demographic scales; and

• Outcome: Conserving biodiversity while justly transitioning to net negative emissions economies and securing the sustainable and regenerative use of natural resources.



#### Six Strategic Recommendations



- 1. Take a systems approach to transformation
- Partner with political movements to achieve equitable and just transformation
- 3. Link societal with personal ('inner') transformation
- 4. Update how we plan for transformation
- 5. Facilitate shifts from diagnosis and planning to transformative action
- 6. Improve our ability to adjust to transformation as it occurs


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





Will we need to start restricting the use of water?






